FINAL ORDER AND DECREE.

AND NOW, TO-WIT: this 1st day of March 1956, on motion of Louis Rosenberg, Attorney for the petitioners, upon due consideration of the petition filed herein, and it appearing to the Court that proofs of publication of notice, as required, by law, have been filed, the Court finds that the conditions prescribed by law have been complied with, and believes that it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petitioners, and does hereby grant same, and decrees that the Township of Plum, a Township of the Second Class, located in the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as designated in the petition, be incorporated into a borough in conformity with the prayer of the petitioners; that the corporate style and title thereof shall be "The Borough of Plum", and that the boundaries thereof without any exclusion shall be as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the low water line of the Allegheny River at the line common to the Borough of Oakmont; thence along the boundary line between the Township of Plum and the Borough of Oakmont, South 21° 40' 45" East, a distance of 59.84 feet to the northwesterly line of the Pennsylvania Railroad right-of-way; thence continuing along the boundary line between the Township of Plum and the Borough of Oakmont by the northwesterly line of the Pennsylvania Railroad right-of-way the following courses and distances: southwestwardly by the arc of a circle curving to the left, having a radius of 6908.55 feet for an arc distance of 137.69 feet; southwestwardly by the arc of a circle to the left, having a radius of 1670.28 feet for an arc distance of 612.27 feet; and South 39° 04' 15" West a distance of 43.08 feet to a point in the centerline of Falling Springs Run; thence still continuing along the boundary line between the Township of Plum and the Borough of Oakmont, by the centerline of Falling Springs Run the following courses and distances:
