Monetary Aid for Domestic Workers

This program works to slow the spread of the virus by providing emergency assistance for domestic workers enabling them to stay home and stay healthy. In order to qualify and apply, they must be a member of the National Domestic Workers Alliance. However, this situation may change with additional funding. Citizenship is not a requirement. Cash is available for up to \$400 for distribution via a VISA gift card.
